COVERINGS WELCOMES CHICAGO-AREA PARTNERS TO EXPAND CREATIVE PROGRAM . . .

Coverings, the largest global tile and stone exposition in North America, has partnered with the School of the Art Institute of Chicago (SAIC) and Chicago Mosaic School to develop unique programs that investigate the use of tile as a medium for creative design. Coverings attendees will have the opportunity to view an exhibition of tiled benches, designed and built by students from SAIC, and participate in interactive educational classes presented by the Chicago Mosaic School, when the show takes place April 18 to 21 at McCormick Place in Chicago.

"Partnerships with the School of the Art Institute of Chicago and the Chicago Mosaic School not only allow Coverings to support the dynamic creative landscape in Chicago, but also provide opportunities for Coverings attendees to think about tile and stone materials in unexpected ways," said Karin Fendrich, Coverings show director. "These programs challenge both future and current tile and stone industry professionals to truly understand just what these materials are capable of producing for design projects and how their qualities are best utilized from a technical standpoint."

Over the course of a three-week workshop, SAIC students studying Architecture, Interior Architecture and Fine Arts, will learn about the process of selecting tile materials, creating construction and installation drawings, and fabricating and installing the product to look and perform optimally. During the course, the National Tile Contractors Association will provide instruction on installation techniques, methods and standards. Teams of students will then collaborate to create benches that incorporate tile and stone as the primary construction material. These benches will be on display for Coverings attendees to enjoy, and a panel will judge the benches for the most creative design and exceptional technical execution during a special ceremony held Monday, April 18 at 4:30 p.m.

"The creation of this workshop course with Coverings gives SAIC students the means to explore materials and techniques in collaborative and engaging ways, while establishing connections with the professional world," said Guinevere Johnson, course director and lecturer at the School of the Art Institute of Chicago. "It also will expose this student group to not only the many ways in which tile can be used, but the wide range of professional opportunities available in this international industry — ranging from highly technical skilled work to creative product design."

Through the partnership with the Chicago Mosaic School, Coverings attendees will have an opportunity to interact with tile as a creative medium during workshop and demonstration sessions held at the show. During the demonstration sessions, Chicago Mosaic School instructors will educate attendees on how the different tools and materials can create various mosaic effects, while the interactive workshops will provide hands-on introductions to materials best suited to mosaic applications and the techniques required for handling and application during a mosaic project.

"There is an extraordinarily vast opportunity to use tile in creative and artistic expressions," said Karen Ami, Founder and Executive Director of the Chicago Mosaic School. "Holding these sessions at Coverings creates an opportunity for trade professionals, whether designers or contractors, to interact with tile in an imaginative way that allows them to expand their material vocabulary."

Two workshops and two demonstrations will be held each day on April 18 through 20, with limited capacity for each session. Advanced registration for the workshops and demonstrations is required and can be completed during general show registration.

CERAMIC TILE AND STONE CONSULTANTS ANNOUNCES WINNER OF 2016 STONE SURVEY CONTEST . . .

Ceramic Tile And Stone Consultants, Inc. (CTaSC), a national company providing marketing research and business planning services, announced that Nancy Epstein, founder and CEO of Artistic Tile in Secaucus, NJ, is the raffle winner of a \$600 Apple gift certificate. She was one of a substantial number of industry members that participated in the sixth-annual Stone Survey conducted by CTaSC.

More than 1,582 manufacturers, quarries, importers, distributors and fabricators were invited to take the Stone Survey. Developed by CTaSC using progressive online technology, the confidentiality of all participants was assured by compiling data anonymously. Each person who completed the survey was offered a free summary of the survey results and an entry into the raffle for the \$600 Apple gift certificate.

Participants answered a series of questions based on their business category. Importers and distributors were quizzed on the types of stone they buy and sell, slab and tile sizes, sales by type of customers, and sales by types of applications. Fabricators were asked to answer questions about their fabrication business, including equipment and tool brands, purchase and selling price of stone, annual sales and types of finished products and stone types that are fabricated.

The 2015 Stone Survey results are included in the "Catalina 2015 Natural and Manufactured Stone Product Industry Report" prepared by Catalina Research, a prominent research firm, and CTaSC. This comprehensive publication, which has been updated from 2013, provides an in-depth analysis of the U.S. and Canadian stone industry based on U.S. government statistics and market resources. The report contains the timely data that allows users to evaluate market size, growth potential, end-use markets, factors driving demand, profitability, market share and the competitive environment.

"It's essential to have reliable and detailed information about the stone industry," said Donato Pompo, president of CTaSC. "The information and data lets us know what's going on in the market so we can capitalize on the opportunities. It also helps us further understand how the current state of the economy will affect our future business challenges and opportunities."

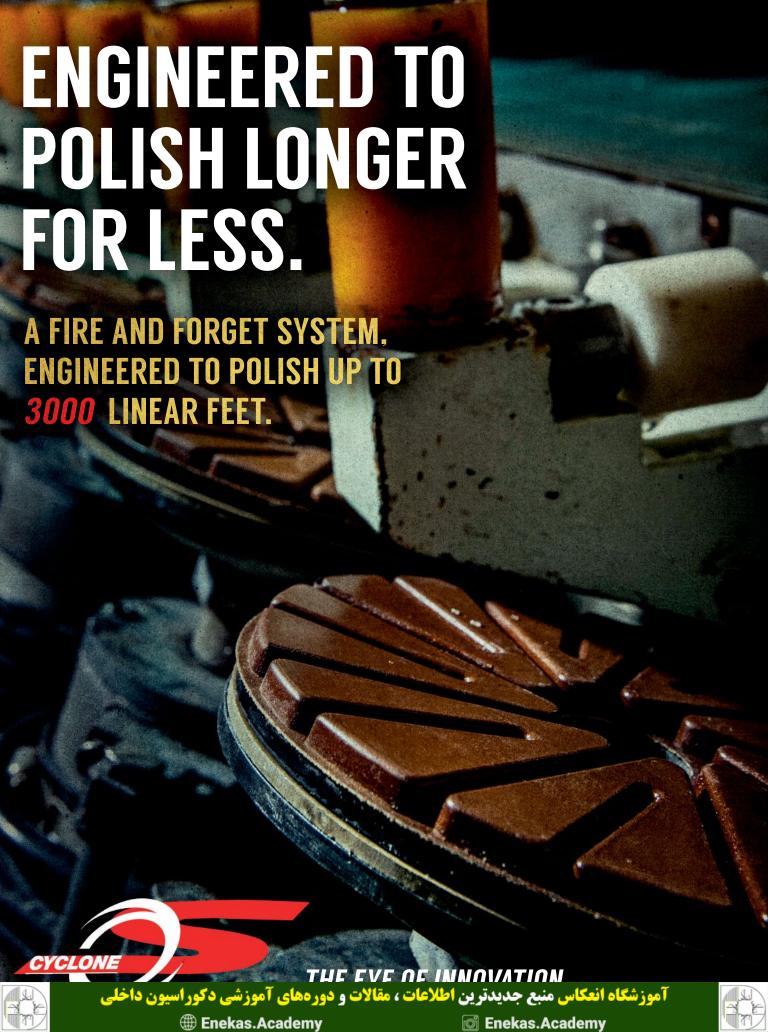














A multi-faceted stoneworking operation

Through various acquisitions, Sims-Lohman has grown to be an extensive fabrication business — with locations in six states

incinnati, OH-based fabricator Sims-Lohman has been in business since the company was locally founded in 1971 under a different name. Years later, in 1998 and in an effort toward expansion, the Steinman family, who remains the owner today, bought Moellering Industries. They also purchased Sims-Lohman, a design-oriented cabinet company, and adopted the name. Following this acquisition, two granite fabrication companies located in Cincinnati, OH, and Columbus,

OH, were acquired in 2006 and 2007, thereby entering the company into the granite sector. Sims-Lohman, which distributes kitchen cabinets and fabricates granite, quartz surfacing, laminate, cultured marble and solid surface countertops, currently has

Building a handcrafted operation

While Stone Restoration of America has experience in countertop fabrication, the Charlotte, NC-based company now concentrates on custom stone restoration and can offer its customers a diversity of services

ne of the biggest lessons learned by fabricators from the 2008 recession was that a business must be adaptable. Some changed their target market; others changed the foundation of their business. For Stone Restoration of

America, located in Charlotte, NC, the company changed entirely. "A small group of us originally started in 1993 just polishing marble floors," said John Lambert, president of Stone Restoration of America. "As we started to build a reputation in the area, people

would ask us to do more. We went from one employee, all the way up to 120 employees. We also went from fabricating kitchen countertops to now providing services for maintaining buildings and parking decks, as well as having the capacity to perform

waterproofing and restoration for large capital projects."

Right before the economic downturn, the Charlotte market was flooded with fabricators that it didn't make sense for Stone Restoration of America to continue fabricating kitchens. While fabrication isn't the focus of its business, it still has six workers on staff who can fabricate. "Recently we finished, and were nominated for a Trinity Waterproofing Award from SWRI for a 25,000-square-foot granite plaza at Two Wells Fargo Center," said Lambert. "We had to de-

clad and waterproof the existing plaza, planters and old water features of the center. All the granite, about 5,000 pieces, had to be removed in-tact, labeled for location and stored off-site due to limited jobsite space. Because some pieces broke and some other work had to be done, we still had to fabricate 6,000 square feet." The granite used for the project was supplied by Coldspring of Cold Spring, MN.

The six fabricators that Stone Restoration of America has are cross trained so that the majority of their time is in the field as stone setters. The company has 11 restoration crews, all varying in size up to 30 people large, as well as having six additional maintenance crews.

When fabrication is needed, the company does the majority of it by hand using its Denver bridge saw. "We have a lot of skilled guys that can do everything by hand," said Lambert. "They can do rough cut, a lot of good router work, and grind and polish." The company also does a significant amount of stone polishing work each month. Depending on how busy it is, it will polish 30 to 50 thousand square feet.

Stone Restoration of America does a great deal of work in the field and repair work. The company uses tooling and accessories from Stoneway Supply, located in Pineville, NC; sealers from Prosoco, located in Lawrence, KS; as well as Aqua Mix and Tenax, located in Charlotte, NC. Additionally, they rely on Daltile as a source of stone and tile, among other suppliers.

The Charlotte facility, where Stone Restoration of America is based, is a 25,000-square-foot area. The company also has a satellite office in Raleigh and one coming to Myrtle Beach, which is anticipated to be 3,000 square feet. "We are licensed in the two Carolinas, Virginia and Georgia," said Lambert. "Our business grew 58% last year and a big part of that is the beach business which is starting to grow." While the company has no real stone inventory, they do a lot of stone matching for their restoration projects. "We are fortunate to have a lot of resources for when it comes to matching stone on a restoration project," said Lambert. "We have samples everywhere that are usually

pretty close, and we have guys who have been in the business long enough to look at a stone and know what it is and where we can get it." Because of the invaluable knowledge his employees have, Lambert has a strong

employee retention rate and is fortunate to have people wanting to work for him. "You can see it all around, and I think all businesses see it, there is a shortage of skill workers out there, who can do what we can do," said Lambert.

"We have a retention rate of seven to 10 years for our employees. I believe a lot in giving our employees good benefits and a profit sharing program. As far as training new employees, our approach is to have a steady mix of inexperienced

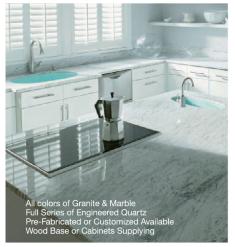

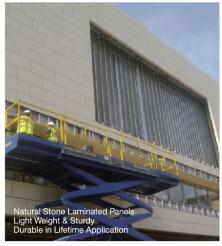

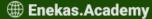

on software and hardware. I believe that now is the most opportune time to invest in technology to compete, and remain a serious player in our industry.

Catena: Eight reasons: To be more competitive on a market, which is more and more global; to triple the working hours: a CNC machine can work 24

hours a day contrary to an operator; to simplify the staff management; to comply with delivery terms; to improve productivity and profit; to improve time management: the fabricator can dedicate his time to look for new customers, capture new jobs and schedule marketing actions; to make the creativity faster and more accurate; and finally to produce high-quality work at a more efficient rate.

Cicchini: Investing in SawJet technology immediately adds to the bottom line by significantly speeding up the fabricating process, increasing material yield, and providing a safer environment for workers. Faster production and increased yield leads to being more competitive in the marketplace, and the additional capacity created allows for additional business to be added in the same manufacturing space. The Baca Systems robot uses digital template files, reducing the chance of mistakes and removing hours of labor associated with setting up a manually-templated job. During the stone exhibition, MIA president David Castellucci and MIA+BSI CEO Jim Hieb provided a keynote address about the MIA+BSI's Natural Stone Promotional Campaign to a standing room only crowd.

This year's event attracted approximately 25,500 visitors, with foreign attendees coming from 60 different countries. The U.S. comprised 25% of attendance, followed by large showings from Italy, China and Spain.

"The results are very positive," stated Tales Machado, the President of Sindirochas (Stone Association from

the importance of an international fair in Brazil. Today we can say that the event is a showcase of Brazilian dimensional stones."

Natural Stone Promotional Campaign

This was the second consecutive year the MIA+BSI exhibited at the show. The organization is dedicated to unifying the stone industry, and was successful in gaining several new members. MIA president David Castellucci and MIA+BSI CEO Jim Hieb provided a keynote address about the MIA+BSI's Natural Stone Promotional Campaign to a standing room only crowd interested in learning about the launch of usenaturalstone.com and the success of several positive stories about natural stone published in key consumer and architectural magazines.

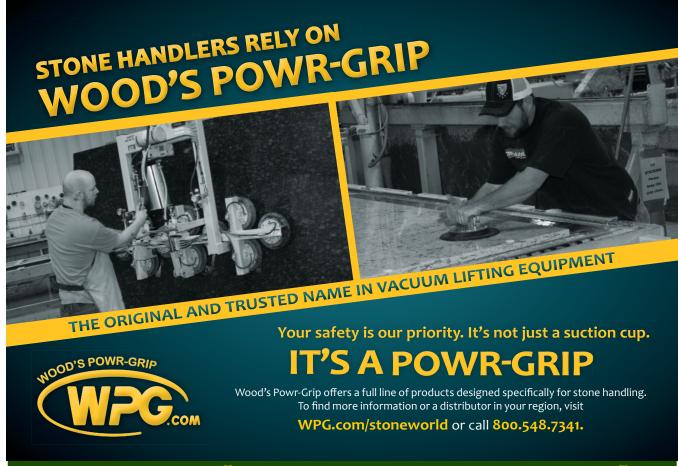
This keynote address and key industry meetings held at Vitoria Stone Fair served as the backdrop for perhaps the biggest story of collaboration the natural stone industry has seen since 2008. Shortly after M S International (MSI) announced the initial financial pledge to support the MIA+BSI-led Natural Stone Promotional Campaign, approximately 25 members of Centrorochas (Brazil's The Center for Exporting Industries of Dimension Stones) were the first companies outside of North America to join the industry initiative. The combined MSI and Centrorochas pledges — along with support from Daltile, Polycor, Pedrini, Tenax and others — provided the seed monies to launch the multi-year campaign.

The real impact of the campaign will be seen in the spring of 2016 as campaign content will begin to be shared with stone companies for redistribution on social media and other online outlets. MIA+BSI is also building a database of marketing professionals who are sharing story ideas and pictures to be used in the campaign. "It is exciting to see

an article published in a magazine that reaches 500,000 people, but it is more exciting when that same article is redistributed on social media sites where the impact is much larger," said Hieb.

The viral marketing component of the campaign is vitally important when you recognize that over 43% of all consumer buying decisions are made from research done online." The online component of the campaign allows for a global impact.

The Vitoria Stone Fair also introduced the first winners of MIA's 2015 Kitchen of the Year, Tithof Tile & Marble in Northbrook, IL, and Bath of the Year, Walker Zanger in Sun Valley, CA, Pinnacle award winners. Both awards were sponsored by the Fair and included travel arrangements to attend the event/show. The success of both awards prompted the Vitoria Stone Fair to commit to support both awards again for 2016. MIA+BSI will soon announce the Call for Entries for 2016 consideration. □

Renewing the life of a Utah bank

A restoration of the interior of Cache Valley Bank in Logan, UT, relied on a palette of granite to create an elegant and functional modern banking facility

ache Valley Bank in Logan, UT, has occupied the same location since 1984, and in January 2014, the decision was made to extensively remodel the entire interior of the building. One of the goals of the new design was to create

an environment consistent with the late Victorian era, but at the same time, keeping it a fully functional and modern banking facility.

To accomplish this, several different types of granite were used throughout the space, all fabricated and installed by Evolution Design, Inc. of Smithfield, UT. First completed was the employee break room, featuring Verde Fantastico countertops with a 4-cm ogee edge. The material was supplied by M S International, Inc. (MSI) of Orange, CA. The chimney in this room was tiled out

of pennies by Gary Olsen construction of Logan, UT. In the central area of the bank, a

In the central area of the bank, a total of 51 slabs of Typhoon Green granite, also supplied by MSI, were employed for the wall columns, teller line and vault. For the custom-designed lobby workspaces and teller cage workspaces, six slabs of Galaxy Black granite, supplied by Daltile of Dallas, TX, were selected. Lastly, a single slab of Steel Gray granite from MSI was used for the executive office custom furniture. All of the stone had a 3-cm thickness, with varied slab sizes and a polished finish.

"The Typhoon Green granite provided beautiful colors and subtle graining that was interesting without being overwhelming," said bank owner, Peter Daines. "Many samples were examined, but when the Typhoon Green was found, we knew it was exactly what we wanted. We think it sets the tone of elegance, charm and warmth. The carpet's dramatic pattern, the extensive use of walnut woodwork, heavy window treatments and coffered ceiling with glazed moldings, all combine with the granite to create a period feeling that permeates the space."

Being it was a complete interior redesign, some obstacles were encountered. "As one of the owners, the biggest challenge was creating the

The motif used on the top of the vault, creating a multimember crown molding complete with dentil mold, was a bit of a challenge as it was something that the fabricator never contemplated prior to this project.

design," said Daines. "We had an idea of what we wanted the finished product to be, but getting the setbacks, overhangs and dimensions so they all worked together was challenging. As far as watching Evolution implement our design concepts, I know two things. First, they were very professional and patient about working with us as we tweaked the design. Secondly, what we asked them to do was a bit out of their comfort zone. The large amount of vertical granite up the columns on the walls, with complicated reveals was new to them. The motif we used on the top of the vault — essentially creating a multi-member crown molding complete with dentil mold — was something that they had never contemplated prior to this project."

Brett Brunson, owner of Evolution Design, Inc., agreed that the project was a collaborate effort. "We had done similar type reveals, but not on such a large scale or on vertical columns," he explained. "We did do samples of all of the reveals and edge details to have approval from the owners before fabrication.

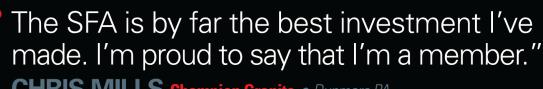
"The fabrication wasn't too complicated, but getting the exact margins that they wanted on the dental portion of the molding was a little tricky based on our tooling options," Brunson went on to say. "We were able to accomplish

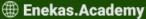

what they wanted by utilizing our bridge saw and running two parallel cuts to create the desired spacing. We fabricated the rest of the pieces for the crown molding on our CNC machine and installed it all one layer at a time."

According to Brunson, the columns were prepped with ½-inch Durock cement board. "We then adhered everything with Latapoxy 310 adhesive and Mapei's Granirapid mortar," he said.

The renovation started in January of 2014 for Evoluion Design, the bulk of the stonework was completed by July of 2015. "There were so many phases, but we roughly dedicated a day a week — or sometimes two days a week — to them throughout that time period," explained Brunson. "So we handled our main residential work load the other days of the week and scheduled in por-

tions at a time as they needed them."

As for the installation, typically three installers were on site at any given phase of the job. "Usually they were there for a day or two per week, as we finished sections at a time," said Brunson.

Ultimately, all the hard work paid off, as all who see the new space are complimentary. The city of Logan, UT, the Cache Chamber of Commerce and the Historical Society have all expressed their satisfaction with the end result and many of the contractors involved have been singled out with attention and awards.

"Perhaps the nicest compliments we, as owners, have received is from our long list of contractors (we prefer to call them craftsmen and artisans) who tell us it was the most fun they've had at work in years," said Daines.

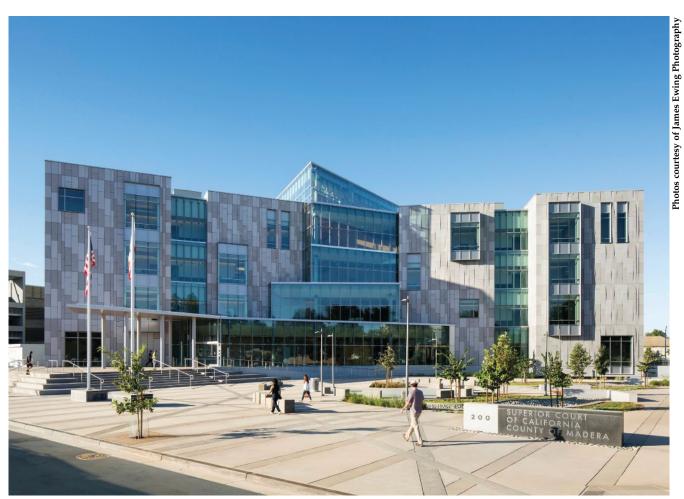




Creating a town square

With the completion of an elegant stone courthouse, a new public gathering space is established in the city of Madera, CA

In December 2009, design began on a brand new structure that would become the Madera Courthouse, in Madera, CA. Los Angelesbased architectural firm AC Martin, was commissioned to design the 105,000-square-foot four-story building.

four-story building, which had been positioned to connect with the existing historic courthouse and courthouse park, creating a new town square. One of the primary goals for the new courthouse was to showcase the pride of democracy and to provide a place to assist the workings of the American justice system.

"The historic fabric of the city of Madera relates to the development of resources from the nearby Sierras," explained Tammy Jow, senior designer at AC Martin. "With that in mind, the

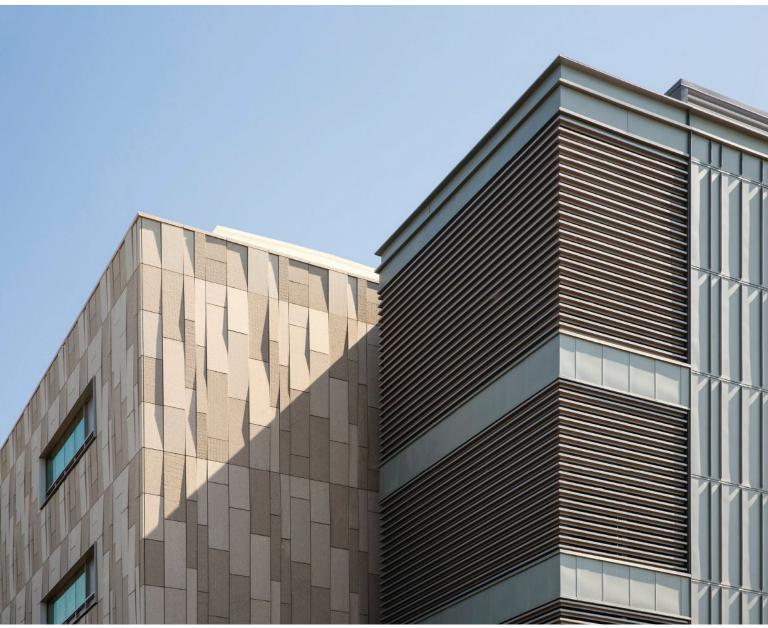
judges of the Madera Superior Court asked that this same metaphor be used in the new courthouse design. Specifically, the judges requested the use of granite from the nearby Sierra WhiteTM quarry, wood from the Sierra National Forest and glass to represent the spectacular waterfalls and winter ice formations in the area."

Construction on the courthouse commenced in early 2012. The structure is composed of four stone modules with a central atrium or "glacier." The granite stone modules are from the local Sierra WhiteTM quarry in Raymond, CA, which is owned and operated by Coldspring® of Cold Spring, MN. The Sierra WhiteTM granite was used primarily on the exterior walls, but was

also featured on the atrium's interior design, as an accent on the window openings and on the corridor portals.

Additionally, the exterior of the building boasts mechanically attached Sierra WhiteTM granite pieces, which were supplied by Coldspring®. Installed in a vertical basket-weave pattern, the stone was engineered in house by installer SMG Stone's engineering department in Sun Valley, CA. The pieces were then transformed with a waterjet finish, adding texture to the base pattern. Further enhancing the design of the courthouse are exterior flag posts fabricated from Academy

Black® granite, also from Coldspring's quarry in Clovis, CA.

"The stone complemented the building and the adjacent building materials, specifically the metal panels," said Solomon Aryeh, owner of SMG Stone, who both installed the stone and worked closely with the architect on design development. "The stone was part of the project inspiration, as the architect's intent was to recreate the strads at half dome in Yosemite." In total, approximately 25,000 square feet of stone was utilized to create a challenging, but unique, facade. "The design creates an eye-catching identity

by using texture and shifting planes," said Dan Rea, senior vice president of sales and marketing for Coldspring®. "Sierra White™ is one of the most consistent natural stone materials quarried around the world. The design intent called for a 'natural' appearance for the building's exterior skin. A stone exterior that illustrates the subtle changes found in nature."

To accomplish this, four different finishes were used, including thermal, Diamond® 10, Diamond® 200 and Diamond® 300. "Diamond® 10 richly highlights the stone's reflective crystals, enhancing and contrasting

glass. The transparency of this 'glacier' reveals the warmth of the wood wrapped walls in the lobby. 'Madera' in Spanish means 'lumber' or 'wood.' Wood is used responsibly and detailed beautifully in the interior spaces to transition from the monumental scale of the courthouse to the intimate scale of the individual.

The main obstacle faced by the team existed in the intricacy of the exterior facade's vertical basket-weave pattern. The natural configuration created staggered joints instead of a typical continuous line where the pieces of stone met. During installation, it became a challenge for the installers to hoist the pieces onto the scaffold. SMG Stone overcame this obstacle by using an electrical chain fall with two men staged on the bottom floor and two at the top floor feeding the installers the large stone pieces.

The courthouse opened its doors in September 2015. So far the reaction has been overwhelmingly positive, and the building is in the process of completing LEED certification for sustainability. The granite from the Sierra White quarry contributed to the idea of using regional materials toward the pursuit of LEED certification. The quarry, which is only 20 miles from the project site, is well within the range of the 500-mile radius for regional materials.

with the depth of the darker colors," explained Rea. Diamond® 200 is a consistent, coarse-textured surface that exposes the natural beauty of the stone's crystals on a pronounced jagged background, while Diamond® 300 is a heavy water pressure treatment which reveals the radiant crystals within the stone's surface through a dramatically coarse texture."

Additionally, a three-dimensional appearance was created by a multiple

of plane axis on the face of the stone, causing dramatic lighting effects. A typical facade module is 16 feet high x 8 feet wide, and piece sizes were generally around 3 square feet.

"The pattern alludes to the natural striations seen at Half Dome in the Yosemite Valley," added Jow. "Ice and water influence the design of the central atrium, which is organized in a series of geometric angles and forms with a skin of ultra-clear







The courthouse opened for business in September 2015. So far, the reaction has been overwhelmingly positive, and the building is in the process of completing LEED certification for sustainability and 20-mile proximity to the Sierra White™ quarry in Raymond, CA.

"There is a great sense of pride in the building by the local citizens of Madera, CA," said Jow. "So far, I have only heard good comments. The staff of the courthouse invested countless hours of their personal time, championing the project with a hands-on approach, working with the state, design and contracting teams. They should be highly commended for the success of the project."

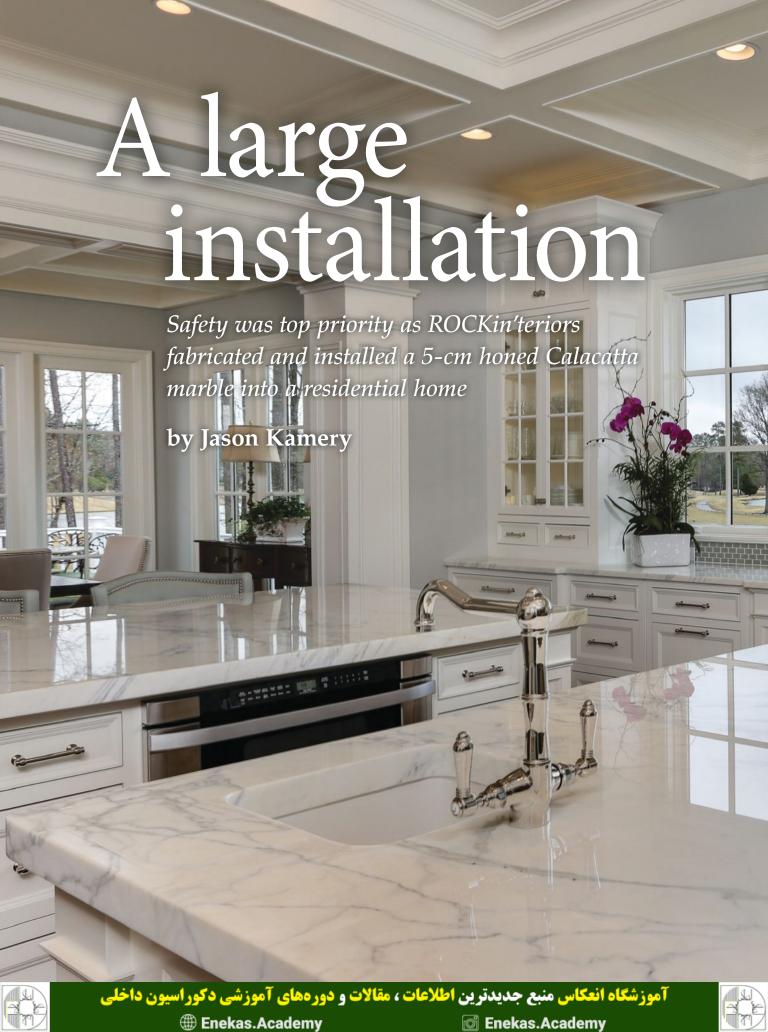

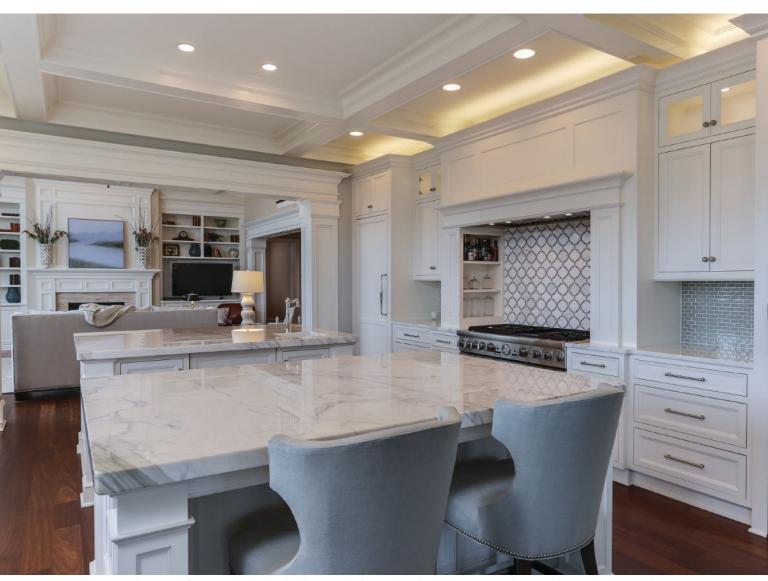
It was about a six-month project because the stone was a special order from Italy. Before the renovation began, Grandlienard knew that they would have to allocate more time for the installation process because of the time it takes to receive shipments across the Atlantic. In order to get the two 10-foot seamless island slabs into the home, they had to use a special crane. The project required 10 men, along with a crane operator.

"Fabrication was pretty uneventful, though the weight and size of the slab made the safety of our installation team especially important," said Grandlienard. "We are used to hightouch residential installs like this, though we never underestimate the importance of safety. It's better to have an excess of installers on-hand, rather than strain with fewer craftsmen.

"It is always a bit nerve-racking doing a custom cut of this size," Grandlienard went on to say. "The nerves are there up until we deliver and install the project. Plus, safety is always our highest priority, so we

had to be mindful and not rush a delicate process." ROCKin'teriors used a Zonato bridge saw to cut the slab and make sink cutouts. They then polished the stone top and bottom and created a smooth "eased" edge to complement the interior environment. The countertop was sealed after the installation.

Since the homeowner did not have time to fly to Italy and visit the quarry, she was nervous it would not meet her dreams once it arrived. "I reassured her that any premium exotic Calacatta marble will sell," said Grandlienard. "So, if it arrived and wasn't exactly what she wanted, then we would re-order to her desires, and resell the slabs. When the container hit our door from Italy, it was just so over the top gorgeous. The client said, 'I don't know how I worried so

much; it is amazing and beautiful."

Since the completion of the kitchen renovation, the owners have told Grandlienard, that "it's a treat" every time they enter their new space. "Each day, they always see something new and unique about their stone," said Grandlienard. "We've been told guests always offer pleasant commentary about how breathtaking the space is now. It's been such a success, in fact, that we have now moved onto a third phase of another project for the homeowners. ROCKin'teriors has had a hand throughout the whole house. 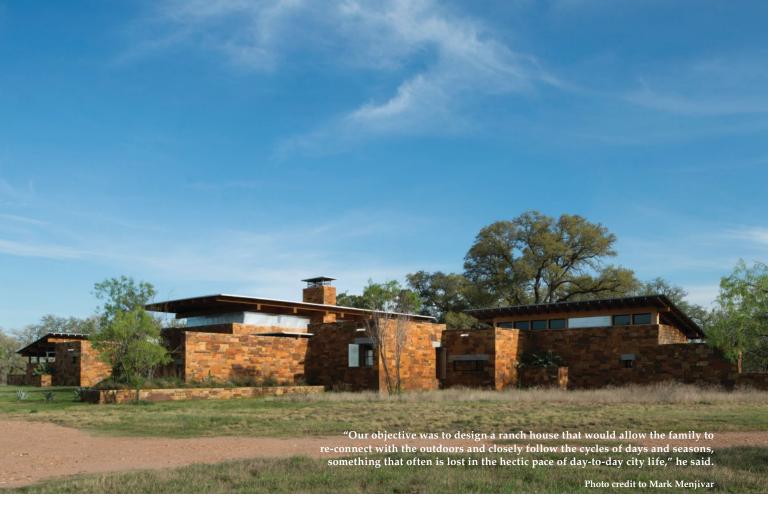

Reconnecting with the outdoors

Inspired by ruins nearby, architect Tobin Smith used nature and local stone to create a getaway ranch house

the thoughts of childhood summer camp in mind — when you slept in a screened cabin, heard the noises of the night, felt the changes in weather and awoke at sunrise — architect Tobin Smith set out to create a retreat inspired by outdoor living. "Our objective was to design a ranch house that would allow the family to re-connect with

the outdoors and closely follow the cycles of days and seasons, something that often is lost in the hectic pace of day-to-day city life," he said. "Devices, including gear driven louvers, roll-up canvases and large pocketing glass doors, open and close the structure. A palette of materials suitable for both interior and exterior conditions, including stone, concrete, steel and

wood, allow floor, wall and ceiling planes to continue from inside to outside — unifying the carious spaces." The family camp comprises three kid cabins, a master cabin and a central mess hall gathering space, all linked by screened porches and corridors.

Big Tree Camp is located 75 miles from San Antonio, TX, and its architecture features a Texas quarried,

iron-rich, rust-colored sandstone. The same material from the same source is used for both exterior and interior applications, and it is installed in the same manner so that the distinction between outdoors and indoors is minimized. In the fields along the road on the way to the ranch, stone remnants of structures – walls and chimneys – can be seen. Many of those building remains are over 100 years old and are the same sandstone. Smith knew this was a regional material and the appropriate choice for a contextual modern addition to the landscape.

"The house is tucked behind a stone wall on the north side," said the architect. "It's a geometric outcropping that serves as a wind block in winter months. The facade steps both in plan section housing program and planters, and a lightweight modern structure peer above it, hinting at what lies beyond. The same wall is experienced on the inside as well and serves as a reference as you move from one end

of the structure to the other. Carrying the masonry to the interior makes this stone element appear to be a mass rather than a veneer, particularly where penetrations reveal the overall thickness. This adds a sense of strength to this critical piece of the project and gives it importance."

Utilizing a local source

In total, approximately 5,000 square feet of face stone was employed for the home's design. The residence measures 5,444 square feet with 2,996 of that being air conditioned space. The remaining footage is composed of screened spaces and a two-car carport. Pieces used for the design range from small "chinker" stones — a few inches by a few inches — fitted between the medium and larger pieces, all the way up to pieces in the 1½- to 2-foot range with all of them being approximately 4 to 5 inches thick.

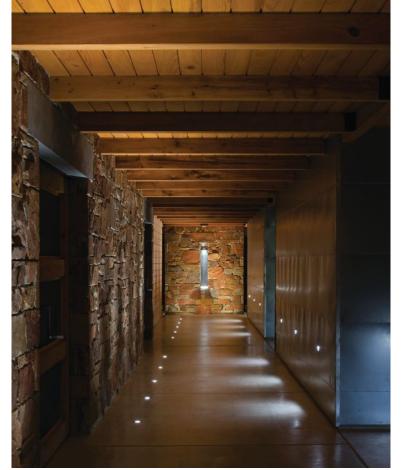
"For the most part, we kept the massive heavy pieces at the bottoms

of walls - specifically at corners to anchor those critical moments," said Smith. "Getting the stone to lay right was a high-pressure affair. We'd long assumed that we'd follow the example of the nearby ruin, but when a mockup was built on site, I immediately thought it wasn't the right solution for our structure. So suddenly there's a team of masons standing around looking at me. Understandably, the masons and the contractor hadn't factored in extended contemplation time for the architect since we'd been so confident in the direction we thought we were going, so we had to practice 'rodeo architecture' as a friend of mine likes to call it. I had eight seconds to sketch and figure it out, think bull-riding. It took a little longer than eight seconds, but we pivoted quickly and settled on the drystacking lay, but not before a few phone calls and emailed photographs to the owners who live out of state."

Smith spent time supervising the installation, but after they established

an overall intent with a series of guidelines, there were just a few minor tweaks along the way. "You don't want to micromanage fine craftsmen; it's important to respect the material knowledge and developed skills they bring to a project and to be trusting," said the architect. "We made a major adjustment after the original mock-up, changing to a dry-stacked lay — eliminating visible mortar as used on the 1880's ruin -- and then backed off and let the team work. While the mortar would have dulled and become less flagrant with time, its presence in that first mock-up caused us to change course and I'm glad we did. Now, from a distance, the stone walls appear unified coming together as masses rather than individual pieces, but up close the tightly fitted puzzle of stones becomes evident and the extraordinary craftsmanship is clear. The masons did a masterful job."

The same 4- to 5-inch-thick stone was used inside and out so that while they were used as a veneer on either side of a water-proofed wood framed wall, it has the heft of a solid masonry wall like the ruin that inspired the project. To further reinforce this perception, Smith returned the stones through punched openings, such as the windows, louvers, so that where the wall is cut, you not only read the 18-inch thickness, but also see stone at that edge. According to Smith, without knowledge of the construction documents or process, you wouldn't know that the wall wasn't solid masonry.

For the exterior, they used cast-in-place concrete lintels over penetrations in the stone wall. "These bridge the gap and carry the stone above," said Smith. "Where possible, we located the galvanized metal scuppers directly above the windows and lintels so that the cascade of falling water when it's raining becomes a focus and celebrated elements. Given our recurrently drought-scarred landscape, rainfall should be celebrated. Opposite the stone wall, we used steel, glass and screened panels with galvanized metal and cypress wood cladding. Lighter in nature and a distinct contrast to the masonry facade, the southern side of the

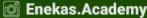

house offers large pristine views of the tangled oaks and a sense of seclusion in each space. The solid stone wall acts as a protecting shield against the winter wind and the lightweight southern side is designed to catch the southern summer breeze."

Completion

Construction of the house took about a year and a half. Since the ranch is an hour and fifteen minute drive from San Antonio, various crews camped on-site during construction to save on commute time, maximize work days and efficiently complete their scope of work. "Rural construction projects always require extreme planning and unusual effort because there isn't a Home Depot around the corner and the cost of every contributor spending a couple hours on the road each day would send labor costs soaring," said Smith.

Response from the project has been positive, the Texas Society of Architects

gave It a Design Award in recognition of outstanding architectural design and achievement and the owners greatly enjoy the ranch house. "They gather there as a family around major holidays and enjoy entertaining throughout the year," said Smith. "The family matriarch has repeatedly shared her feelings about the structure with me saying it appears to have grown from the site and belongs there, it's a native architecture. That certainly was the intent and I love her thoughts on the project.

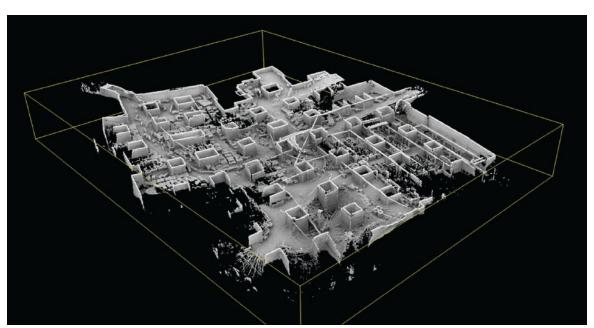

3D laser scanning expands horizons for North American quarrier

Front line techniques integrate geologic and topographic models, dramatically improving accuracy, planning, safety and cost for the Vermont Danby marble quarry in Danby, VT

or hundreds, if not thousands of years, the surveying and mapping of mines and quarries has always been one of the most challenging of all the industrial applications regardless of the current state-of-the-art survey equipment and technology. An

experienced mine (or tunnel) surveyor was always someone that had to use their ingenuity to overcome many obstacles not found when working above ground. In many cases, a lot of the survey documentation was "stored" in the surveyor's memory (job security), not

on paper because until recently, it was very difficult to provide the required 3D technology needed to make its use cost effective and practical for a real time mining operation.

Over the past 15 to 20 years, the surveying and mapping profession

has been undergoing a major transformation. From the analogue methods of measuring distances and turning angles — techniques that go back to the Egyptians — to the use of global satellite navigation systems (GNSS) such as the Global Positioning System (GPS) and perhaps more importantly, what is called 3D laser scanning or LiDAR (Light Detection And Ranging).

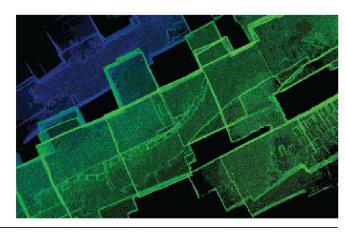
Today, most people around the world are familiar with the revolution that GPS has brought to society. With a low-cost receiver, it is now possible to know where you are anywhere in the world in real time to within about 10 meters, which is incredible. With additional sophisticated techniques, surveying professionals can increase that accuracy to establish high-precision networks that can monitor even the smallest movements of the earth's crust.

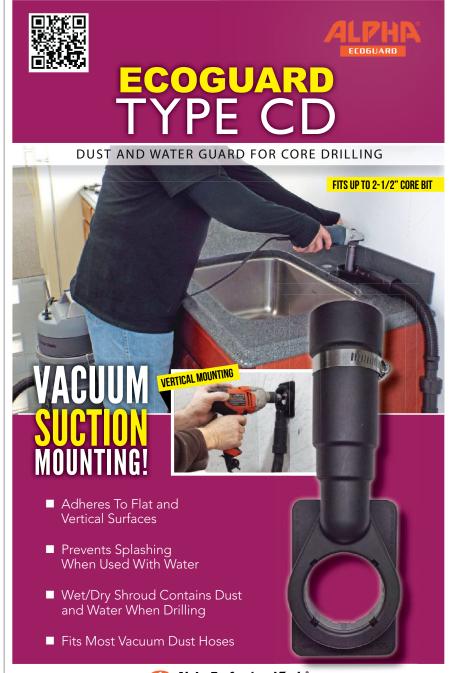
What does the power of GNSS have to do with underground mining and quarrying operations? Unfortunately, not much since the receivers must have a clear line of sight to the satellites. For open pit mines and other above ground operations, GNSS is the preferred method of establishing survey control, but below ground, the game changing innovation is harder to come by.

The power of 3D

Enter 3D laser scanning where like most traditional survey instruments, the scanner is self-contained, and unlike a camera which requires some type of background light source, a scanner is an active system that sends out a beam of laser light and therefore can work even in total darkness perfect for underground applications. Basically, a 3D laser scanner allows a surveyor to capture and document the dimensions of a space in 3D by capturing millions of measurements quickly and accurately using any number of platforms, including tripods, vehicles, handhelds, and most recently, on an Unmanned Aerial Vehicle (UAV). The technology is agile, highly practical and cost effective.

With it now being practical to accurately determine the real world







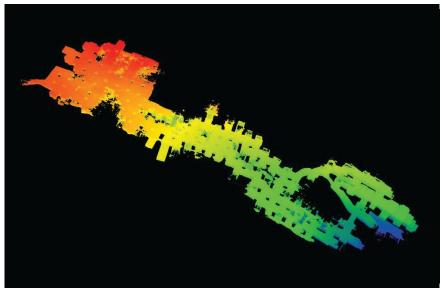

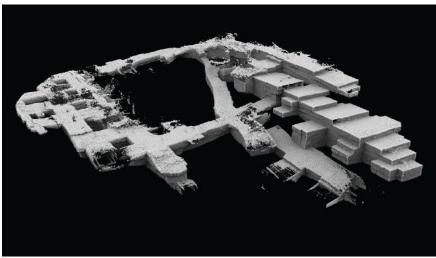








A 3D point cloud of the entire Imperial Danby Quarry shows the site is approximately 2,800 feet long.

dimensions of an underground mine, a surveyor has the information needed to create a 3D model of an entire operation, including all of the levels, giving a true and complete picture. This is a major transformation from the standard way of managing the mining activities, as the operator can now be supplied with virtually unlimited computer-generated visualizations in both the horizontal and vertical directions, and planes.

The decision to go 3D

It is this capability that led to the relationship between Vermont Quarries Corp. located in Danby, VT, and H2H Associates located about two hours south in Troy, NY. The historic Danby quarry, owned by R.E.D. Graniti and Mazzucchelli Marmi of Carrara, Italy, has a reputation for providing one of the finest marble varieties in North America, and H2H has a proven track record of applying breakthrough technical innovation to mining, quarrying and aggregate operations around the U.S.

When the head geologist at the Danby quarry was searching for a mobile scanning consultant, he came across H2H. Previously, they had been working with another survey firm that was using traditional survey methods to simply determine the volume of marble being removed from the quarry.

After visiting the site and determining the status of the existing mapping, H2H proposed that they establish a new survey control network that would cover the entire site. Once that was completed, they would then use 3D laser scanning to develop a 3D geospatially referenced model of the mine

that would have many uses, including tracking inventory volumes, storm water management, structural integrity (pillar alignment) and more.

It did not take long for Vermont Quarries to recognize the potential benefits of using laser scanning to create the 3D model. In addition to those items already mentioned, the data collection is much faster with a laser scanner, more complete, and it is also a much safer method of collecting this valuable data. A multi-year contract was approved to establish the control and then provide quarterly updates documenting the changes that occur as a result of the ongoing mining operation.

The work plan

Physically documenting in 3D the largest underground marble quarry in the world presented H2H with a number of challenges, including the overall scale of the operation. Entering through the same opening that has been in use for over 100 years, twisting and turning for 1 ½ miles inside Dorset Mountain to get to where the Danby marble is now being quarried, you get a true sense of the incredible history of the quarry. Using a survey instrument that is a combination of total station and scanner, H2H established a series of highly accurate and permanent survey control points that can be used to locate the 3D scans and tie all of the information together below ground with that to the above grade surfaces.

The focus was on the massive stone pillars that are left to support the ceiling of the mine. By accurately locating these with the survey instrument, they could

be used to orient and connect the individual scans that were collected for this project using a handheld scanner known as the Zeb1. The technician simply walks around the pillars with the scanner, rocking back and forth in order to collect the required 3D point data. The data is then processed and combined with the survey control data to create the 3D georeferenced model that is accurate to less than 1 foot in the worst case.

The Zeb 1 was selected from a number of 3D data collection and mapping tools that H2H and IMT use to create a complete model of reality in the most efficient manner possible. The Zeb 1 was selected for the following reasons:

- Safety close quarters, dim lighting and a bevy of extraction and processing equipment make for a potentially hazardous space for workers. The Zeb1 allows survey technicians to collect data in the most safe, efficient, and complete way possible, while minimizing exposure to the conditions inside the mine.
- Access limited line of sight between areas that are to be scanned creates a difficult situation for traditional static LiDAR equipment. The mobile nature of the Zeb1 means that a technician can scan all areas that are accessible on foot and in some cases by boat.
- *Operations* the process of mobile mapping in the quarry allows the operations to take place without disrupting the daily operations — no shutdown is required.

Deliverables

Using their powerful 3D visualization software, H2H presented the

results of their survey to the Danby Quarry management. For the first time, a complete picture and detailed understanding of the quarrying operation was now available. One of the longtime veteran employees, now in his 80s was brought to tears when he saw the 3D images of the quarry where he had worked for a large part of this life.

Since the quarry does not have their own software, the 3D models

were used to create 2D survey plans and maps that everyone was familiar with. In addition to the regular volume updates, H2H is working with the management to incorporate exploratory drilling data and a site 3D geologic model into the 3D topographic model to provide even more valuable data. It looks like the Danby quarry will be adding a new 3D chapter to its impressive history.
