Pattern I: 6mm needles: stocking st = RS k, WS p. In the md = k all sts. \*knit 15 rows on the outside with bordeaux, 15 rows on the inside with aubergine, 1 joining row with aubergine ", rep from " to ".

Joining row: knit as foli: lay both pieces with wrong sides together (= purl sides together). Then, with aubergine, k tog sts from both needles one st at a time, at the

same time, hold the 3rd circular

Tip: The reversible jacket is knitted double, in other words the inside and outside are knitted separately and these 2 layers are joined together at intervals. The jacket may

be worn inside out.



### Back

Cast on 80 (88) sts with a scrap of contrasting yarn. Knit 15 rows of pattern I with bordeaux and 6mm needles. Now undo the cast-on row and place these sts on a 2nd needle. With aubergine and 6mm needles purl 1 row (= fold line), then work 15 rows of pattern I. Knit a joining row with aubergine, then continue knitting in pattern I. At 29 (33) cm from the cast-on place a marker at each end of the row and continue knitting straight. Complete each side and both pieces separately after about 42 (48) cm (= after 7 (8) stripes), first with bordeaux and then with aubergine. For shoulders, cast off at sides on every other row: 7 sts once + 6 sts 3 times (9 sts twice + 10 sts once). When back measures 48 (54) cm cast off the middle 16 (18) sts for the neck and cast off at neck edge on every other row: 4 sts once + 3 sts once. Knit the 2nd piece with auberaine.

#### Left front

Cast on 60 (66) sts with a scrap of contrasting yarn. Knit 15 rows of pattern I with bordeaux and 6 mm needles. Now undo the cast-on row

and place these sts on a 2nd needle. With aubergine and 6 mm needles purl 1 row (= fold line), then knit 15 rows of pattern I. Knit a joining row with aubergine, then continue in pattern I. Place marker for armhole and work shoulder at the right edge, as for back. Neck: Complete the two pieces separately after about 44 (50) cm, on a 3rd row after the 7th (8th) stripe. Cast off 20 (22) sts at the left edge and then at the same edge on every other row cast off 8 sts once, 3 sts once and dec 1 st 5 times. Knit the 2nd piece with aubergine.

#### Right front

Knit to mirror the left front.

### Sleeves

Cast on 52 (69) sts with a scrap of contrasting yarn. Knit 15 rows of pattern I with bordeaux and 6 mm needles. Now undo the cast-on row and place these sts on a 2nd needle. With aubergine and 6 mm needles puri 1 row (= fold line), then knit 15 rows of pattern I. Knit a joining row with aubergine, then continue in pattern I. At 22 cm from

the cast-on, inc 1 st at each end of every 6th row 8 times (alt of every 4 and 6 th row 10 times) = 68 (78) sts. Leave sts when sleeve measures about 45 cm, after a joining row.

#### Finishing

Close seams, sew the seams from the inside and the outside (lacket is reversible). Collar: Beginning in the right front with bordeaux, pick up 119 (125) sts (front = 40 (42) sts each side, back = 39 (41) sts). With bordeaux pick up the same no. of sts form the apposite pieces on the inside. With the 3rd needles close to knit in the rnd = 238 (250) sts. Work 1 rnd in k, then, with bordeaux, knit a joining row over the sts of both needles. Knit the collar on 3 needles, knit pattern I in the rnd. When collar measures 15 cm, with the varn double, k tog sts from the upper and lower needles and cast off at the same time. Take care not to gather. Sew the sleeves between the markers using Kitchener stitch, work the seams from the inside and the outside.



**Tip:** Knit the edge sts in pattern, when making up sew seams just half a stitch in from the edge.

#### Back

Cast on 105 (117) sts with 4 mm needles. Knit in pattern I, beginning with p1. After 3 cm change to 4.5 mm needles and knit in pattern II, decreasing 1 st on the first row = 104 (116) sts. At 31 (30) cm from cast-on (measured hanging) place a marker at each end of the row and keep knitting straight.

Shoulders: At 25 (26) cm from markers, cast off at each end of every other row: 7 sts 5 times (7 sts once + 8 sts 4 times).

Neck: At the same time, at 58 cm, cast off the middle 28 (32) sts. Work each side separately and cast off at neck edge on every other row, another 2 sts once and 1 st once.

#### Front

Cast on 109 (121) sts with 4 mm needles. Knit in pattern I, beginning with k1. After 3 cm change to 4.5 mm needles and **distribute pattern** as foll: 1 edge st, 35 (41) sts pattern III, 37 sts pattern III, 35 (41) sts

pattern II, 1 edge st. After the 62 rows of pattern III, knit over all sts in pattern II (= 104 (116) sts). At 31 (30) cm from cast on, place a marker at each end of the row and keep knitting straight. Neck: When front measures 51 cm cast off the middle 18 (22) sts. Work each side separately and cast off at neck edge on every other row, another 3 sts once, 2 sts once, 1 st twice and then 1 st after 4 more rows. Shoulders: At 25 (26) cm from markers cast off at each end of every other row: 7 sts 5 times (7 sts once + 8 sts 4 times).

### Sleeves

Cast on 55 (59) sts with 4 mm needles. Knit in pattern I, beginning with p1. After 3 cm change to 4.5 mm needles and distribute pattern as foll: 1 edge st, 8 (10) sts pattern II, 37 sts pattern III, 8 (10) sts pattern II, 1 edge st. For shaping, inc 1 st first at each end of every 4th row 16 times and then every 6th row 5 times. After the 62 rows of pattern III, knit over all sts in pattern II. Loosely cast off all sts when sleeve measures 47 cm = 92 (96) sts.





Pattern II: 4.5 mm needles: pleat over 12 sts, to the R: place 4 sts on a cable needle in front of your work, place the next 4 sts on a 2nd cable needle and turn anti-clockwise (WS is now at front), place the next 4 sts on a 3rd cable needle. Lay the 3 cable needles parallel behind one another (from front to back, needles 3, 2 and 1) and k tog sts from all 3 needles, one at a time. Pattern III: 4.5 mm needles: pleat over 12 sts, to the L: place 4 sts on a cable needle in front of your work. place the next 4 sts on a 2nd cable needle and turn clockwise (WS is now at front), place the next 4 sts on a 3rd cable needle. Lay the 3 cable needles parallel behind one another (from front to back, needles 1, 2 and 3) and k tog sts from all 3 needles, one at a time,



Back
Cast on 99 (109) sts with 3.5 mm needles. Knit in pattern I. Change to 4.5 mm needles after 16 om and inc 20 (22) sts evenly over the first row, as foli: 1 edge st, 3 sts pattern I, inc 1 k-wise or p-wise tol; 7 sts pattern I, inc 1 k-wise or p-wise tol; 7 sts tol 1\*, rep from 1\* of \*, ending with 3 sts pattern I, inc 1 k-wise or p-wise tol, 10 sts pattern I, inc 1 k-wise or p-wise tol, p. 1.1 edge st = 119 (131) is 2.

Armholes: Begin armhole at 22 (26) cm from cast-on (measured hanging) cast off 1 st at each end of every other row twice = 115 (127)

Shoulders: When armhole measures 32 cm cast off at each end of every other row: 4 sts once + 5 sts 7 times (5 sts 5 times + 6 sts 3 times)

Neck: At the same time, when back measures 56 (60) cm cast off the middle 31 (35) sts. Work each side separately, cast off at neck edge on every other row, another 2 sts once and 1 st once.

#### Front

### Knit as for back.

Neck: At a length of 50 (53) cm cast off the middle 15 (19) sts. Work each side separately, cast off at neck edge on every other row, another 3 sts once, 2 sts twice, 1 st 3 times and 1 st once after 4 more rows.

Work shoulders to match the back.

#### Sleeves

Cast on 45 sts with 3.5 mm needles. Knit in pattern I. Change to 4.5 mm needles after 14 cm. For shaping, inc alt (1 st 4 times + 2 sts once) at each end of every other row until you have 145 sts (= 50 sts each side). Tip 1: The shawl is knitted with the




yarn double.

Tip 2: To begin with knit in rows. Also knit the border in rows on circular needles.

Cast on 210 sts with 7mm needles and 2 strands of yarn. Knit in pattern I, for the sloping sides, at each end of every other row k2tog, until only 6 sts are left on the needles. Loosely cast off these sts.

# Finishing

Pick up sts for border, with 2 strands of yarn pick up 1 st from each st along the sloping edges of





the shawl and 1 st from each of the 6 cast-off sts. Purl 1 WS row, working twice into every 3rd st. Now knit 6 rows of pattern II and then loosely cast off all sts.

Cast on 154 (170) sts with 3 mm needles. Knit in pattern I. After 2 cm change to 3.5 mm needles, knit in pattern II and dec 38 (42) sts evenly over the first row = 116 (128) sts. 427 cm from cast-on (measured hanging) place a marker at each end of the row. Keep knitting straight.

Shoulders: At 18 (20) cm from markers, cast off at each end of



every other row, as foll: 5 sts 7 times (5 sts 3 times + 6 sts 4 times). Neck: At the same time, at 48 (50) cm from cast-on, cast off the middle 40 (44) sts. Work each side separately and cast off at neck edge on every other row, another 2 sts once and 1 st once.

#### Front

Knit as for back.

Neck: At a length of 42 (43) cm cast off the middle 24 (28) sts. Work each side separately and cast off at neck edge on every other row, another 3 sts once, 2 sts twice and 1 st 3 times, then 1 st after 4 more rows. Shape shoulders to match the back.

#### Sleeves

Cast on 230 (238) sts with 3.5 mm needles. Knit in pattern II. For side shaping, cast off 4 sts as smoothly as possible at each end of every other row 19 times. Continue knitting straight on the rem 78 (86) Sleeve cap: At 36 cm from cast-on, cast off at each end of every other row, as foli: 4 sts 4 (5) times, 5 sts once and 6 sts once. Loosely cast off rem sts when sleeve cap measures 4 (5) cm.

# Finishing

Close seams, leaving 10 cm open at the end of each sleeve. Neckband: With the circular needle pick up 116 (124) sts (front = 70 (74) sts, back = 46 (50) sts). Knit pattern I in the md. When neckband measures about 2 cm cast off all sts loosely, in pattern. Set in sleeves between the markers on the front and back.


Cast on 59 (63) 69 (73) sts with 5 mm needles. Knit 2 rows in pattern I, then change to 7 mm needles and work in pattern II.

Armhole extension: At 44 (43) 42 (40) cm from cast-on (measured hanging) cast on 1 st at each end of the row, 1 st again after 4 rows and after 2 rows = 65 (68) 75 (79) sts.

Shoulders: When armhole edge measures 19 (20) 21 (23) cm cast off at each end of every other row as foli: 4 sts once + 5 sts 4 times (5 sts 5 times) 5 sts 3 times 4 6 sts twice (5 sts twice + 6 sts 3 times).

Neck: When back measures 68 cm

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cast off the middle 15 (17) 19 (21) sts. Work each side separately, after 2 more rows cast off 1 st as smoothly as possible at neck edge.

#### Left front

Cast on 43 (45) 48 (50) sts with 5 mm needles. Knit 2 rows in pattern I, beginning with p1. Change to 7 mm needles and work in pattern II. Work armhole extension and shoulder at the right edge in the same way as for back.

Neck: When front measures 68 cm cast off at the left edge as smoothly as possible: cast off 21 (22) 23 (24) sts once and 1 st after 2 more rows.

#### Right front

Knit to mirror the left front.

# Sleeves

Skip 1 ch st from the beginning chain and work into the next ch st 3 tr tog + ch4 + 3 tr tog + ch1 (= first corner of the poncho) and repeat \*-\* 29 times. Skip 1 ch st from the beginning chain and work into the next ch st 3 tr tog + ch4 + 3 tr tog + ch1 (= second corner of the poncho) and repeat \*-\* 14 times. Switch to rve porridge and close the row with 1 sl st into the 3rd ch st from the beginning. 62 treble groups in total.

Row 2: using the rye porridge yarn, ch4 (= 1st tr + 1 ch st), crochet into each ch st between treble groups 3



tr tog + ch1 and crochet into both corners 3 tr tog + ch4 + 3 tr tog + ch1. Crochet 2 tr tog into the last ch st on the row. Switch to berry porridge yarn and close the row with 1 sl st into the 3rd ch st from the beginning.

64 treble groups now in total.

Row 3: using the berry porridge varn, ch3 (= 1st tr), crochet 2 tr tog into the ch st on the previous row, crochet into each ch st between treble groups 3 tr tog + ch1 and crochet into both corners 3 tr tog + ch4 + 3 tr tog + ch1. Switch to off white varn and close the row with 1 sl st into the 3rd ch st from the beginning.

66 treble groups now in total. 1 treble group increased at both corners on each row.


Now crochet 1 row with off-white, 1 row with sand, 1 row with Ice, 1 row with rye porridge, 1 row with sand. Now crochet \*1 row with off white, 1 row with sand, 1 row with rye porridge, 1 row with berry porridge, 1 row with off-white, 1 row with sand, 1 row with Ice, 1 row with rye porridge, 1 row with sand, 1 row with off-white\*. Repeat \*-\* once more. Break the yarn.

### Finishing

Neckline: Using the 4.5 mm hook and the rye porridge yarn, work 3 rows of double crochet into the neckline edge. Begin at where the shoulder will be. On the 2nd and 3rd rows, work 3 dc together at the corners. Break the varn.

Tassels: For each tassel, use eight approx. 30 cm long strands of the sand-coloured yarn. Fold the bundle of strands once. Pull the folded end between treble groups at the edge of the poncho. Pull the open end







### STITCH PATTERNS

#### Colourwork pattern:

Work stockinette st following the chart and the written instructions.

Garter stitch: Knit all rows.

Moss stitch: Row 1: \*k1, p1\*, repeat \*-\* to end. Row 2: knit the knit sts and purl the purl sts. Row 3: \*p1, k1\*, repeat \*-\* to end. Row 4: knit the knit sts and purl the purl sts. Repeat rows 1-4.

Ribbing / k1, p1 ribbing: \*k1, p1\*, repeat \*-\*. On the wrong side rows, knit the knit sts and purl the purl sts.

K1, p2 ribbing: \*k1, p2\*, repeat \*-\*. K2, p2 ribbing: \*k2, p2\*, repeat \*-\*. Ribbing in the round: \*k1, p1\*, repeat \*-\*. Stockinette stitch: Right side rows: knit all stitches. Wrong side rows: purl all stitches.

### Back stitch

With right sides together, work a back stitch along the edges of the pieces.



### Grafting

When a piece is finished and the stitches are not bound off, but left on hold on the needles. Thread a wool sewing needle and

with the right sides facing you, sew the stitches together inserting the needle in the centre and alternating one stitch from one piece with one from the other and always inserting



the needle through the previous stitch again so that the pieces are firmly joined. Release the stitches from the needle once they have been



sewn as shown in the diagram. These seams are flat and invisible from the right side.

### Side seams



This type of seam is also invisible and is worked with the right sides facing. Place the two pieces together with straight edges touching and work back and forth from one piece to the other picking up the bar of yarn of the first row at the side of the edge stitch of one side, then draw the pieces together by picking up the bar of the second row on the opposite side. Continue inserting the needle from one piece to the other as shown in the diagram.

### Tubular bind off

Used when an elastic edge is needed.

After completing the knitting, stitches remain on the needle. Leaving a length of varn which equals twice the length of the edge you are finishing, cut yarn.



1) Thread varn into a wool sewing needle and insert through the first 2 sts



2) Insert the needle through the first stitch again and then through the third stitch.



3) Insert the needle through the second and fourth stitches.



4) Go back to the third stitch, then into the fifth stitch and continue working in this sequence.



5) After reaching the last stitch insert the nee-dle through the penultimate stitch again then into the last stitch.

Cut yarn and fasten off.

### Single bind/cast off



Slip first stitch on needle and knit the follow-ing stitch.



Using the tip of the LH needle, pass the slipped stitch over the knitted stitch.



Knit the next stitch and with the tip of the LH needle pick up the first stitch on the RH needle and pass it over the other knit stitch, so we are left with only one stitch is on the RH



After all the stitches have been bound/cast off, cut yarn, pass end through the inside of the last stitch and pull firmly so that the stitches don't come loose





### Decreasing at the beginning of a row

When forming an armhole or neckline shaping, binding/casting off is done at the beginning of the row.



Slip 1 stitch purlwise (as if to purl it) onto RH needle, knit the next stitch, with the tip of the LH needle pass the slipped stitch over the knitted stitch



Knit 1 stitch, pass the second stitch on RH needle over the new stitch. Repeat for the required number of stitches to be bound/cast off, making sure that the tension is not too tight. Bind/cast off the stitches in the same manner at the beginning of the next row = wrong side, but working them in purl.



On the following row, continue the shap-ing as indicated in the instructions until the rounded form of the armhole or neckline has been completed

### Decreasing at both edges of the same row

Often used for ragian sleeves or to highlight an armhole.

These are the decreases where you can see the sloping edges and are normally worked on the right side of the garment.



The decreases are always worked at a distance of x number of stitches from the edge. Here is an example of decreasing at a dis-tance of 1 stitch in from the edge.



At the beginning of the row, always with the right side of work facing you; K1, slip stitch onto RH needle, K1, PSSO.

At the end of the row, always with the right side of work facing you, (the instructions indicate to decrease x number of sts in from the edge, and following an example of 1 st), work to the last 3 stitches, K2 tog, K1.

### Increasing at the beginning of a row

When increasing more than one stitch.



At the beginning of the row, cast on the des-ignated number of stitches. At the end of the row do the same.



Knit or purl the additional stitches following the instructions.

### Intarsia



This technique is used when working with more than one colour in the same row and the distance between colours is across multiple stitches. It is normally used because the design being worked is very large or the motifs are separated with a large distance between them.



In this case, to avoid long floating yarns on the back, prepare a small ball of yarn in each one of the colours and work following the graph or the instructions. It is very important to cross one yarn over the other every time there is a colour change. If the yarns are not interlaced they tend to separate and form holes in the fabric.

### Jacquard

This stitch is used when working with more than one colour in the same row to form a picture or a border. It is normally worked in stockinette st following a graph whereby each square represents 1 stitch and 1 row



With the two yarns behind the work, use the designated colour to work the number of stitches indicated on the graph.



When changing from one colour to another it is very important to twist one strand of yarn over the other strand to prevent a hole forming where there is a colour change.



All the 'floating' yarns will be on the back of the work, as can be seen on the drawing.
